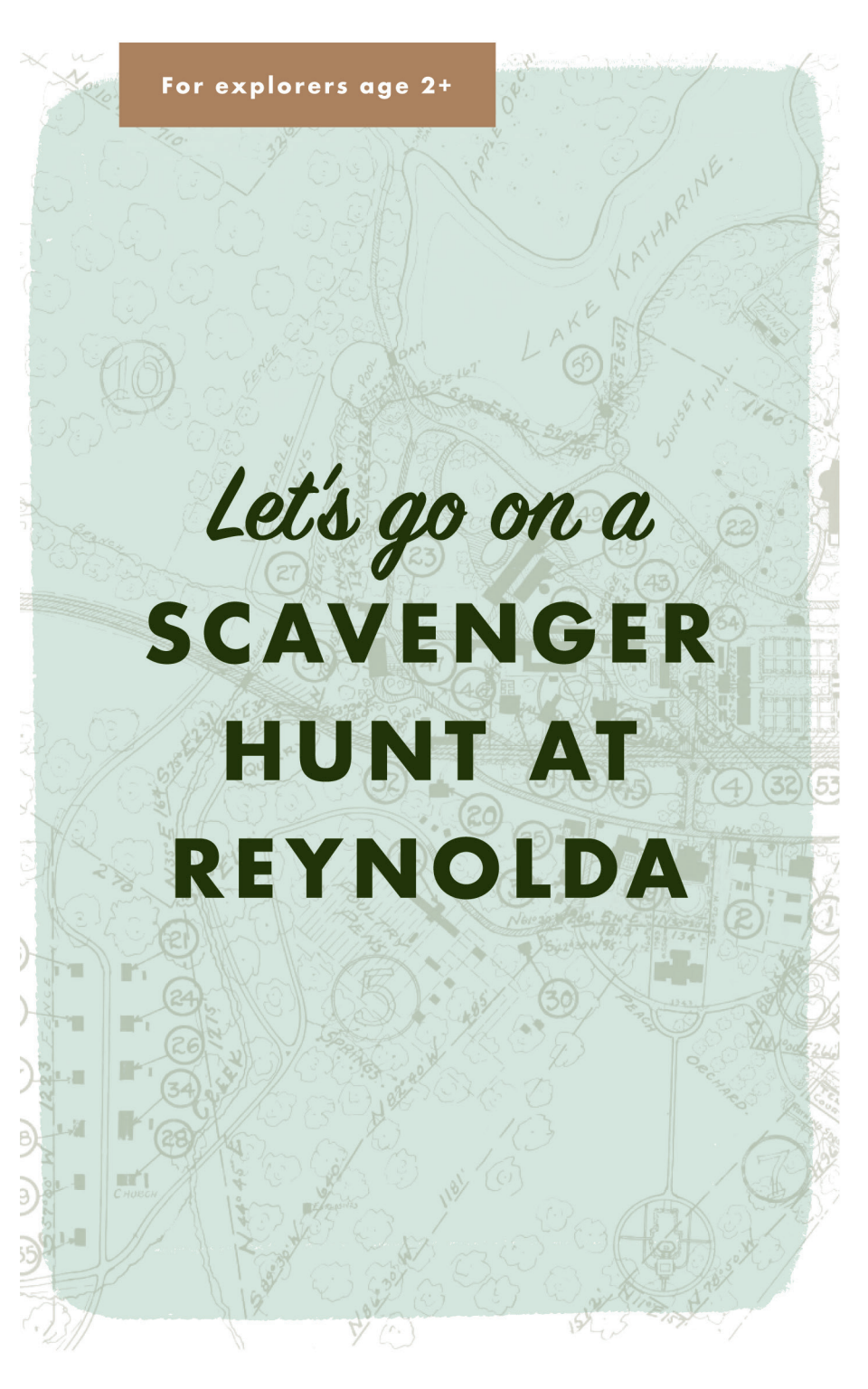

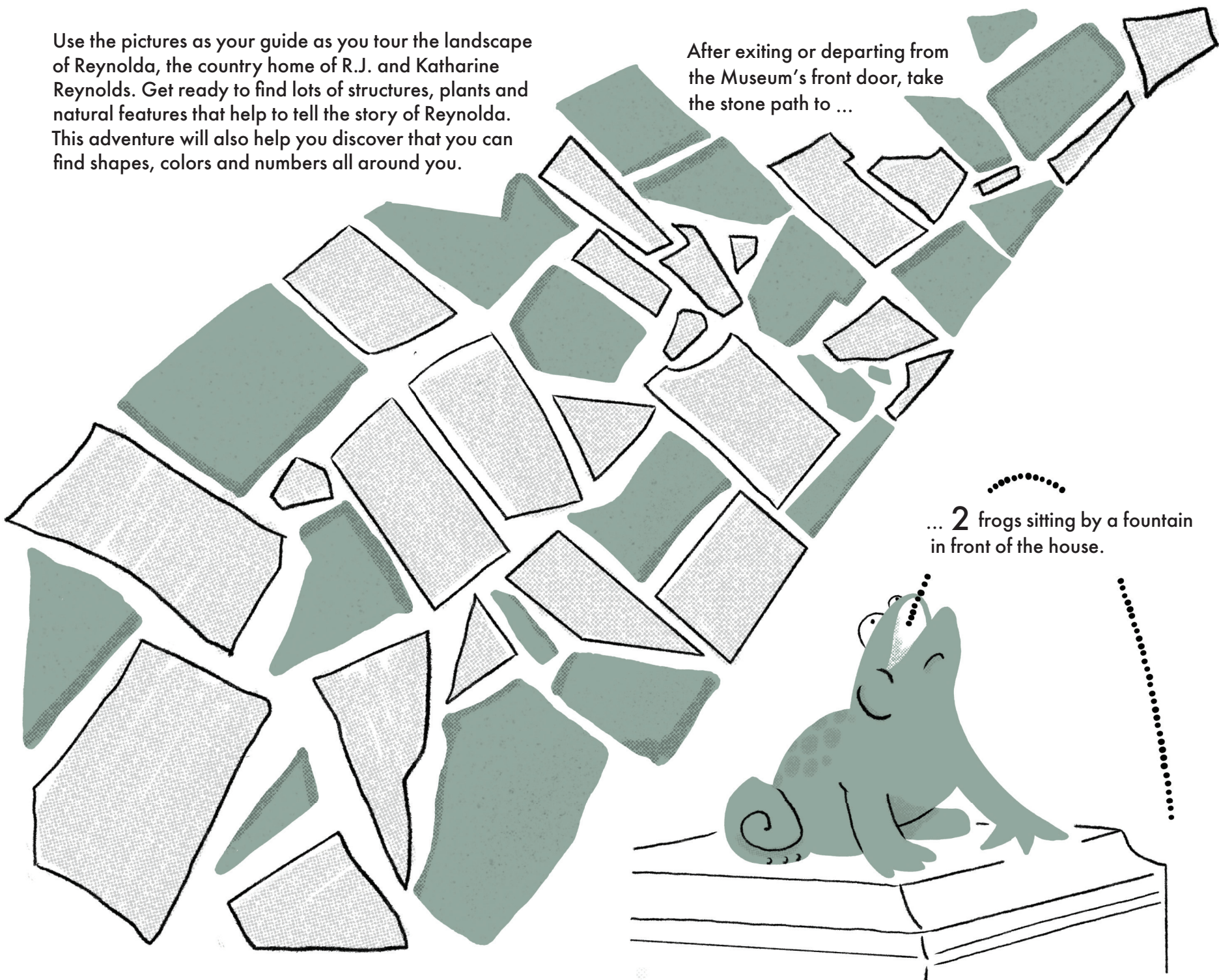
Let's go on a

Use the pictures as your guide as you tour the landscape of Reynolda, the country home of R.J. and Katharine Reynolds. Get ready to find lots of structures, plants and natural features that help to tell the story of Reynolda. This adventure will also help you discover that you can find shapes, colors and numbers all around you.

After exiting or departing from the Museum's front door, take the stone path to ...

... 2 frogs sitting by a fountain in front of the house.



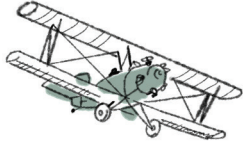
After you spot the frogs take a moment to look at the front of the house. How many windows do you see?

any airplanes?



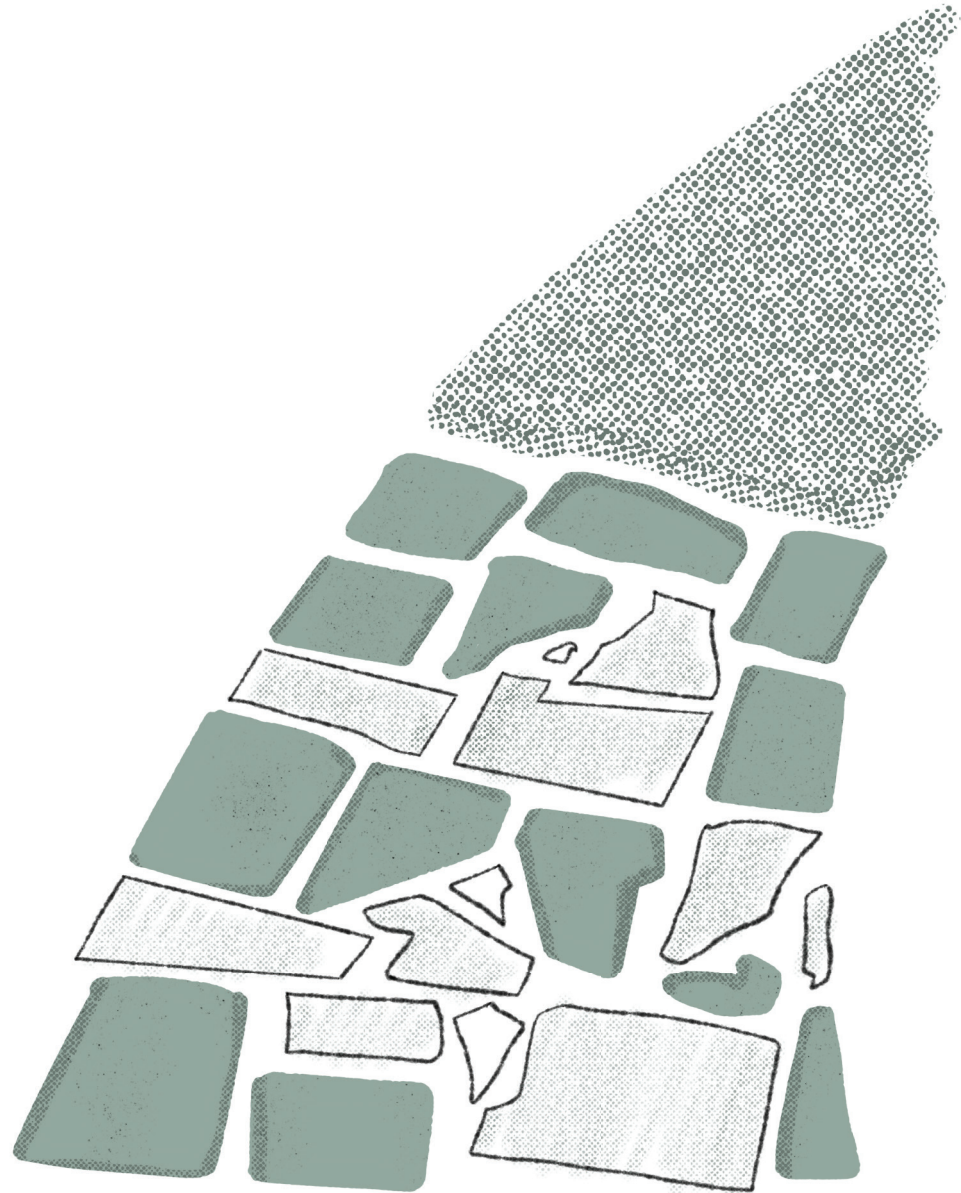
Do you hear
any birds chirping?

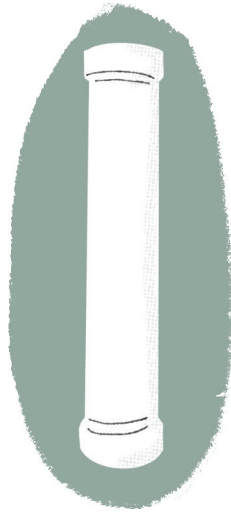
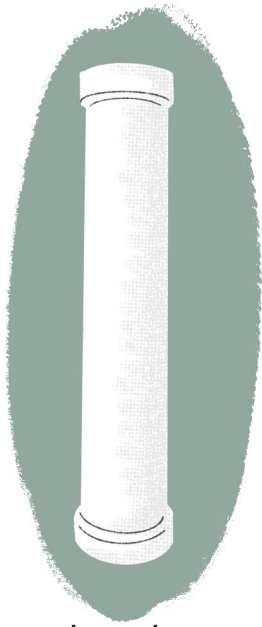


Do you see any

While on this path notice how the stone changes.

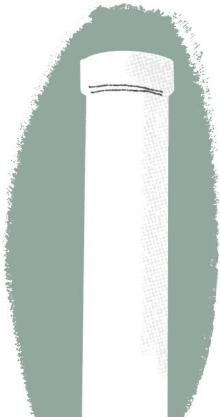




Enter the gardens where you see **16** white columns.

Green



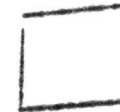

Indigo

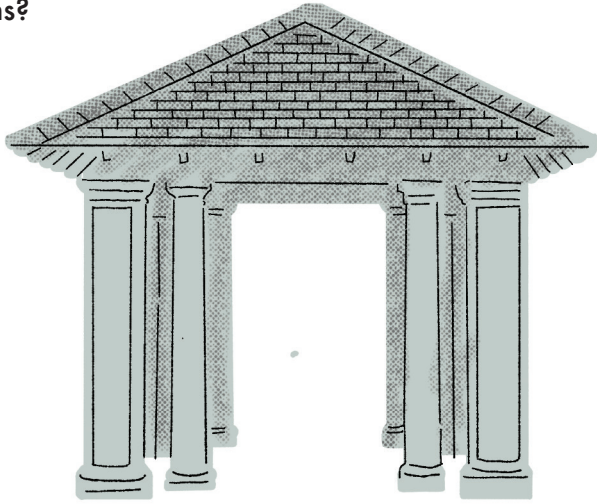

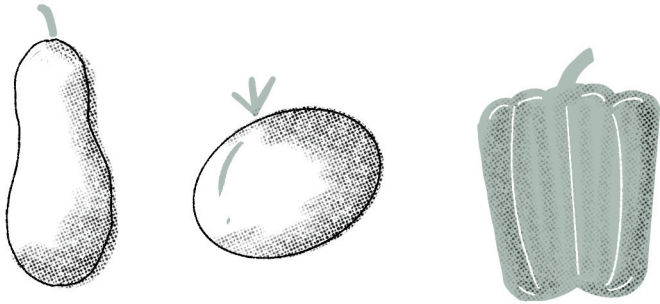


Flower beds will have blue and yellow flowers on one
side and pink and white flowers on the other side of the
grassy path.

Next look for brown tea houses and a fountain with a lion face that separates the lower and upper gardens. What differences do you notice between the lower and upper gardens?



After you walk through the tea houses, do you spot any vegetables?



How many different vegetables can you find? Squash, tomatoes, peppers, rainbow chard are just a few! Different vegetables will grow at different times of year.

Can you find a hummingbird sculpture?



The hummingbird statue is in the pollinator garden. Hummingbirds are a pollinator, meaning that they help plants to reproduce by spreading pollen from plant to plant. This flower bed attracts pollinators such as hummingbirds, bees, and butterflies.

Next, follow the main walkway to the “cedar walk” and see if you can spot a cabin in the woods.



Now turn around. Do you see the doors of a white building that is called a conservatory?



Now walk the path to the conservatory that holds exotic plants.
